General Information Concerning Pre and Post Marital Agreements

Legal Counsel

When agreeing to the terms of a postnuptial agreement or a prenuptial agreement, it is important to know the rights and obligations that you would have under the law simply by the virtue of being married may be significantly different than the rights you will have if you elect to enter into a pre or a post nuptial agreement. Ashley M. Myers, will only represent one party to a pre or a postnuptial agreement and will advise only that particular party of his or her rights and obligations as a result of the marriage. The other party should seek his or her own legal counsel and obtain advice prior to signing a postnuptial agreement.

Disclosure of Financial Circumstances

It is important that prior to agreeing to a either a pre or a postnuptial agreement, you have a general and proximate knowledge of the other party's financial circumstances.

You may waive the right to financial disclosure, however, if I represent you, I will encourage you to provide or to obtain all of the financial information you can, prior to agreeing to the terms of any pre or post-nuptial agreement. You may be aware that you have the more significant resources or you may think the other party has more resources than they do. You may not be aware of the substantial debt the other party has incurred before or during the marriage that may impact

future financial decisions and options. Even if you think you know the financial circumstances of the other party, I do NOT recommend waiving full and fair financial disclosure because it makes it much more difficult for me to advise you if I do not have adequate information.

I will provide my client with a financial affidavit to complete. I will also provide my client with a list of the items generally referred to as "Mandatory Disclosure" in divorce cases, to use as a guide for the type of information that the parties should exchange prior to entering into any form of marital or pre-marital agreement.
